a. Recommendation. To change the systematic protocol of the reporting process of ejections and disqualifications.
(1) Official enters the Ejection/Disqualification via the online submitting process on the NCHSAA web site. Official also informs his/her Regional Supervisor via email an ejection or

Disqualification has occurred in the contest

- (2) The reporting official will receive a confirmation email notifying them the report has been submitted and received by the NCHSAA reporting system
- (3) Email notifications of the Ejection/Disqualification report will go to the AD and principal of the student athlete penalized. In addition, a report will also be sent electronically to the Regional

Supervisor of the reporting official

- (4) AD's will no longer be required to submit a report of the Ejection/Disqualification.
- (5) AD's will be required to send in a confirmation email of receipt of the Ejection/Disqualification report
- b. <u>Rationale</u>. To establish a check and balance system for reports and notifications of Ejections/Disqualifications.
- c. Budget Impact. None.
- d. <u>Educational Impact</u>. Comprehensive notification and confirmation process for the reporting system.
- e. Equity Impact. Same for all schools.
