

Regional Supervisor Regulations

1. Game assignments are to be made via the Arbiter assigning system for all regular season and playoff contests.
2. It is the responsibility of each Regional Supervisor to maintain the standards set forth by the NCHSAA and to supervise, recruit, train, evaluate and regulate the officiating assigning program for their local association.
3. For playoffs and all-star assignments per sport: Each official should be a Class 1 or Class 2 official, must attend the NCHSAA state rules clinic, and score an 80 or better on the NFHS rules exam. (Note: NCHSAA Supervisor of Officials will assign officials to regional and state championship games in all sanctioned NCHSAA sports.
4. Once the season begins, assignments are to be made by the Regional Supervisor based on the qualifications and merit of the official(s).
5. Each association is to have a local Board of Directors composed of officials and school people with at least one school administrator.
6. Each local association is to have a Grievance Committee, as well as a Review Committee, to actively meet, evaluate and handle any concerns brought before them by officials or with officials.
7. The NCHSAA local associations shall not have membership requirements other than those stated in the NCHSAA Handbook and/or regulations.
8. Shall report any unusual occurrences in a contest, inclusive of all reports by officials and/or school personnel, to the NCHSAA.
9. Must use only NCHSAA registered officials. Failure to do so will result in a \$500 fine and review of performance to be conducted by the NCHSAA Supervisor of Officials.
10. Regional Supervisors may charge a maximum association fee to officials in their association no greater than the game fee per sport as approved by the NCHSAA.
11. Regional Supervisors shall not officiate NCHSAA athletic contests in the sport(s) they are assigned except under emergency situations. Approval to work emergency games must be given in writing by the Supervisor of Officials prior to the game assignment.
12. Regional Supervisors cannot charge more than a \$100 maximum check writing fee per sport if schools elect to use this service.
