Plymouth is in the NCHSAA football championship game for the sixth time overall and in their fifth straight year. The Vikings won the 1A title last year with a thrilling 28-20 victory over Robbinsville. The victory came just a year after losing to Robbinsville in 2014, 21-18.

The Vikings have seen Murphy in the state finals as well, as the two teams split in 2013 and 2012. The Vikings took the 2012 edition 20-15 taking the lead in the final minute of the contest while the Bulldogs stunned them in the 2013 game 35-34. The Vikings only other appearance in the championship came in a 2007 win over North Duplin 20-13.

Plymouth was the top-seeded team in the 1A East and are in the playoffs for the 25th time since 1972, compiling a 42-21 record in that stretch. The Vikings are built on solid defense and have held opponents to eight points or less six times this year. The defense is complimented by a strong running game that features Josh Downing at running back and grinds out more than 300 yards per game and has scored more than 40 points seven times this season.

The Vikings are built on tradition as they have won 10 of the last 11 Conference Championships and have compiled 140 wins during that time frame, including the school's three state championships.

Good senior leadership has helped propel the Murphy Bulldogs back to the State Championship for the 11th time since 1972 and first time since 2013 when they defeated Plymouth 35-34 in a wild 1A final.

The Bulldogs are a balanced squad that has seen their first team defense only allow three points during conference play this year with an equally balanced offense. That balance has helped the Bulldogs reel off 13 straight wins since a 42-7 loss to 2A Franklin, including a Smoky Mountain Conference Championship. The defense has only allowed 154 points on the year and is led by Adam Powell who leads the team with 122 tackles including ten tackles for loss.

The Bulldogs offense is piloted by quarterback Joey Curry who has thrown for 1,589 yards and 16 touchdowns on the season without throwing an interception. On the ground, Kadrian McRae and Slade McTaggart have combined for 1,526 yards and 22 touchdowns.

Murphy won a wild third round game against Mountain Island Charter that never saw either team lead by more than one score. The Bulldogs trailed 34-28 with 3:02 to play before Murphy marched down the field, scoring with 53 seconds remaining and converting the PAT to take a 35-34 victory.



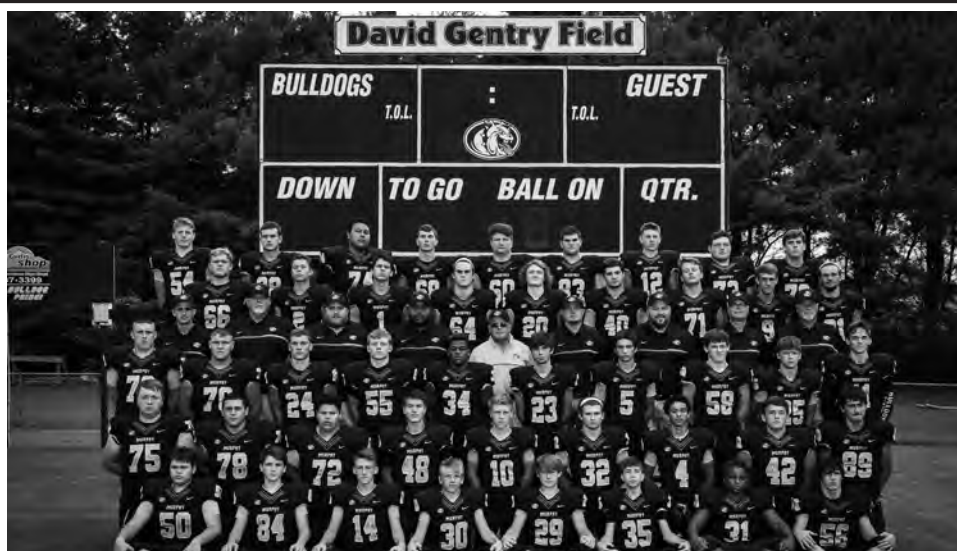

The Bulldogs make their third straight appearance in the 1AA Championship game, winners of the last two. They are led by a powerful and balanced ground attack that has rolled up over 3,900 yards on the year and features four players with more than 500 yards on the season.

Junior RB Desmond Newkirk leads WRH with 159 carries on the season and 1081 yards, scoring 14 times on the ground. Senior QB Aliza Carter has been effective when called up to throw, compiling 1154 yards and 14 touchdowns against just 3 interceptions.

The Wallace-Rose Hill defense has been a force this year as well, picking off 14 passes and recovering 19 fumbles. They've also sacked opposing QB's 30 times in the year while shutting out opponents six times over the course of the season.

With many players back off of back-to-back State Championship teams, the Bulldogs know what it takes to play at a State Championship level. The lone loss of the season came against 2A conference foe Clinton, which the Bulldogs credit with showing them where they could improve in hopes of getting back to the Championship game.

Wallace-Rose Hill makes their ninth appearance in a State Championship Game and are 5-3 in thier trips to a title game.

West Montgomery wasn't picked by many to be in the State Championship, and that's fine with Coach Nick Eddins who says that slight just gave his guys an edge. He said, "These kids just took that as motivation to grow together and play for each other and for their community. Each week they have gotten better and come to work each day knowing the next game will be a bigger challenge than the one the week before."

The Warriors have a pair of tremendous running backs as Jo Leake, a senior, and Damon Rhone Jr., a sophomore, have both tallied better than 1,000 yards on the season. Leake powered the Warriors past Swain County in record-tying fashion, as he scored eight touchdowns in the second round victory, a performance that tied a mark set by T.J. Logan of Northern Guilford in the 2011 3AA State Championship Game. Leake has scored 30 times on the year with Rhone accounting for 22 rushing TD's.

Senior QB Jackson Dozier has been effiecent this season, completing better than 57% of his passes for more than 1,600 yards this season, 21 TD's to just 6 INT's. The defense has recovered 15 fumbles and intercepted 22 passes while racking up 45 sacks.

The Warriors are making the school's fourth State Championship appearance, their first since 2013. They are still looking for their first football state championship.



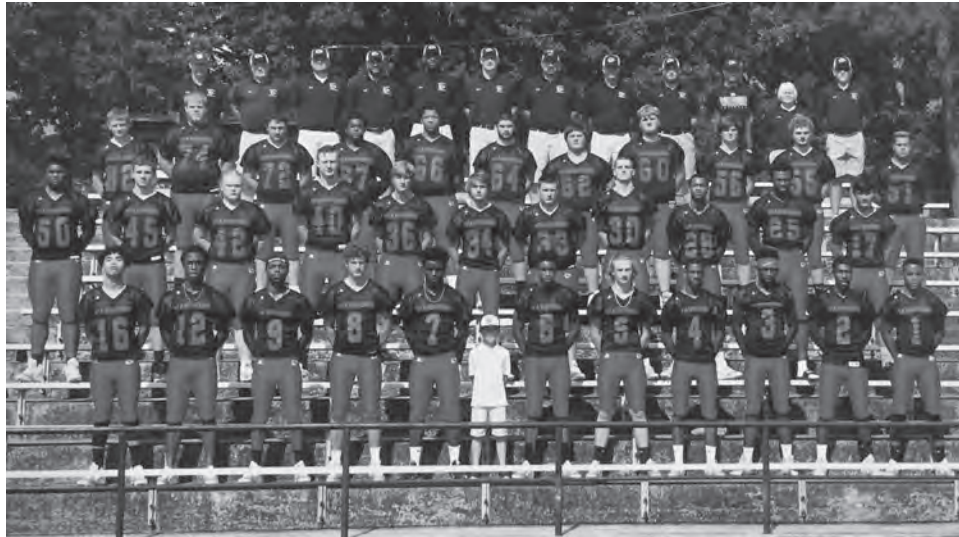

The Monarchs have battled their way through four rounds of road playoff games to make their first appearance in a State Championship Game in their first year under head coach Kendrick Pollock. A senior class championship sweep, that's what the Shelby squad is looking to accomplish as the Golden Lions make their fourth straight appearance in a State Championship Game coming off of back-to-back-to-back championships. The Lions are seeking their ninth state title in their 13th total appearance since 1972.

This year's squad has dynamic playmakers all over the field, including the explosive Jayden Borders at wide receiver. The senior Borders has accounted for 21 touchdowns and 1,638 yards on 76 receptions this season. 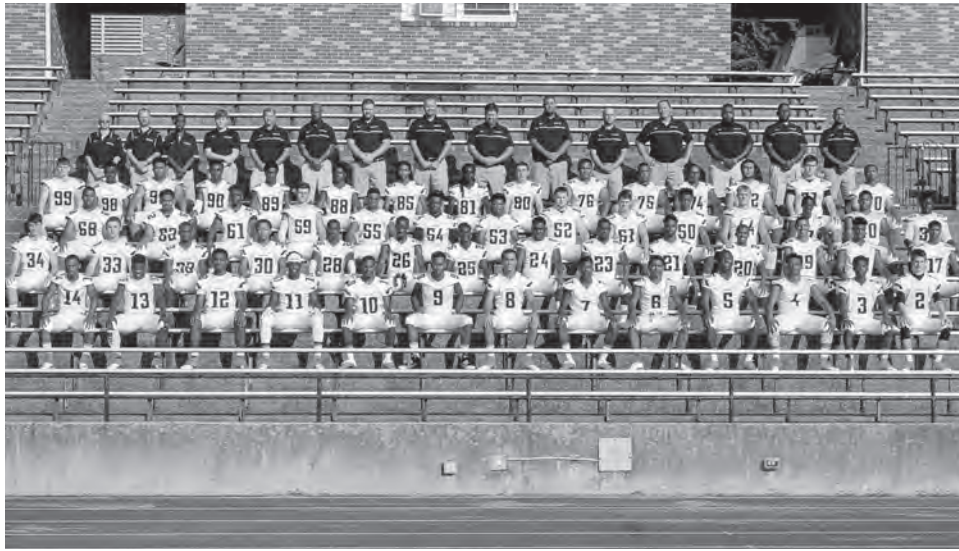

It was a rocky start to the season for the defending 3A Western Regional Champions, as the Red Raiders dropped three straight in the early portion of the season against some of the top competition in the state. Those tough losses weren't unexpected for South Point, after all, the team lost 24 seniors to graduation from a team that made a state championship appearance a season ago, but the losses did help prepare the Raiders for the post-season. The growth has been evident.

Head Coach Mickey Lineberger said, "It took a while to get the pieces of the puzzle in the right places working together." He added, "Our defense has been outstanding all year and our offense has been green and growing."

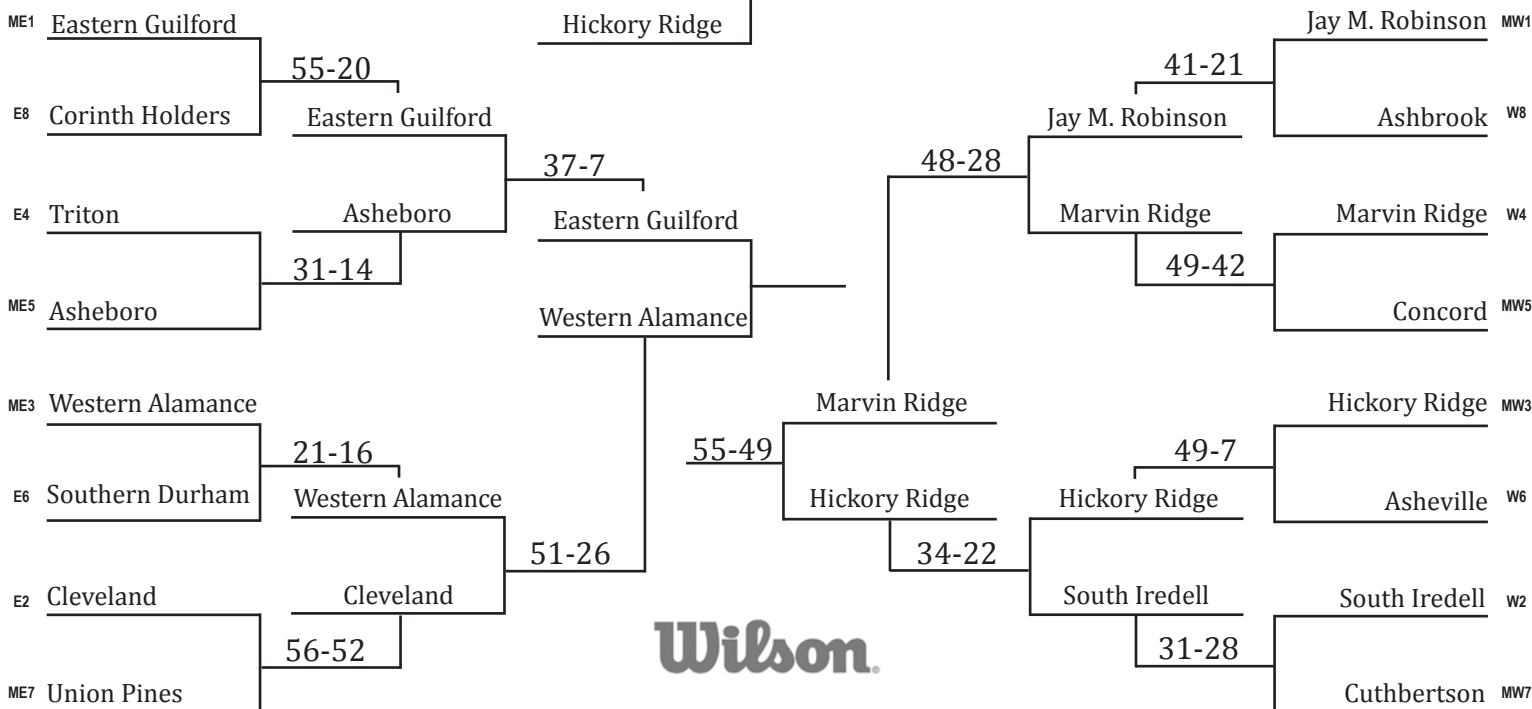
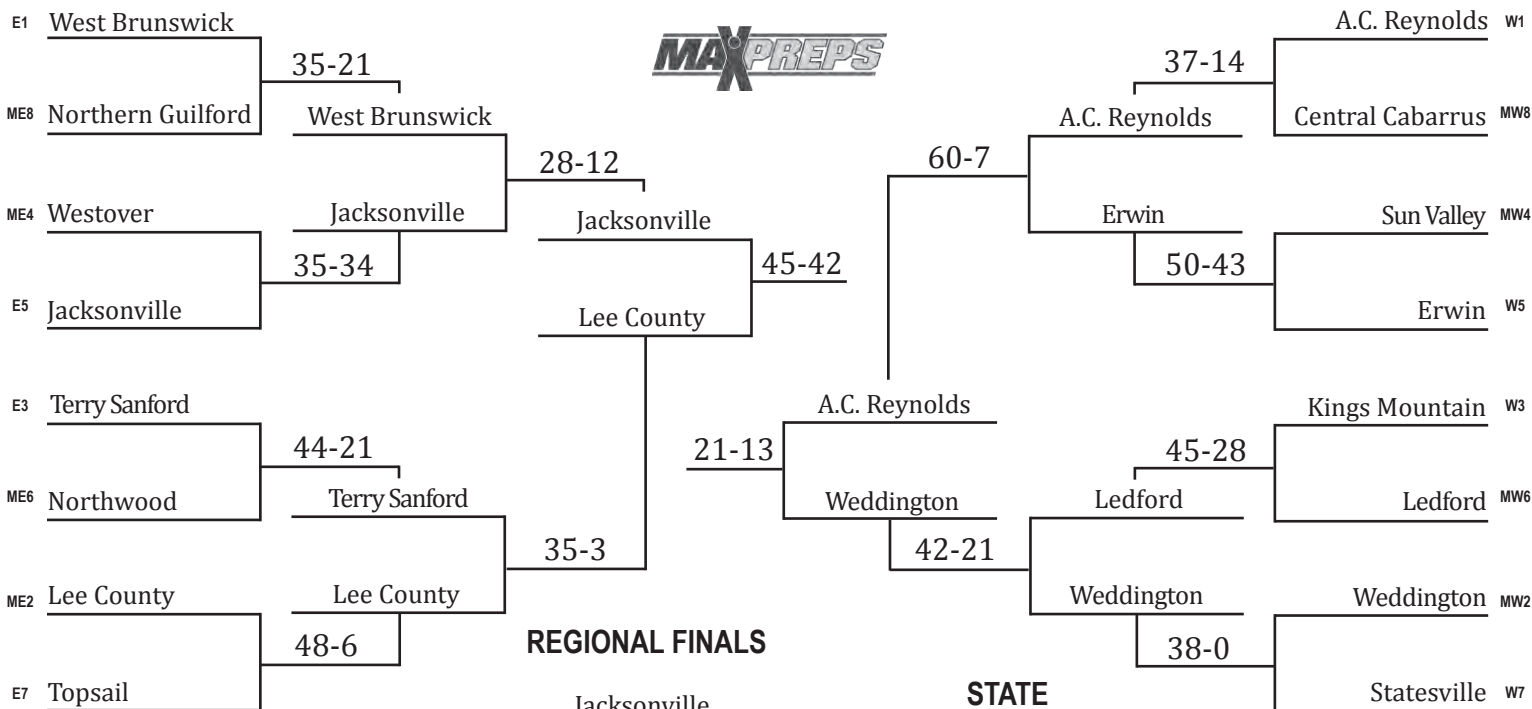

Eastern Guilford ran the gauntlet in the Mid-State 3A as the Wildcats powered through the league's three traditional powers, Northern Guilford, Western Alamance and Eastern Alamance in back-to-back-to-back weeks, clinching the conference title and eventually the top seed in the 3AA Mideast.

Defense is the life-blood of this year's Wildcats, who make the school's first appearance in an NCHSAA Football State Championship game. Coach Doug Robertson said, "We have limited turnovers and been able to cause a lot of turnovers. We've played together as a team and many guys have stepped up to give us more depth."

The Wildcat offense is a balanced one, gaining 2,138 yards through the air, much of it off of the arm of junior QB Dominique Graves who is completing nearly 66% of his passes for 1,620 yards and 16 scores. He's also accounted for 9 rushing TD's and 500 yards rushing, third on a team that has gained better than 2,500 yards on the ground this year. Bryant Barr is the team's leading rusher with 12 touchdowns and 940 yards rushing. Barr has also thrown for 563 yards and 7 TD's on the season.

Safety James Artis is the team's leading tackler with 65 recorded on the season anchoring a defense that has allowed 7 or less points on six separate occasions this season.

Weddington returns to the State Championship for the second time in school history after winning the conference championship for the first time in the school's 16-year history. The Warriors defeated cross-county rival Marvin Ridge 34-3 to claim the title in the final week of the regular season. The Warriors first State Championship appearance was a defensive battle in the 3AA Final in 2014 against Northern Guilford as Weddington came up short 14-7.

This year's Warriors squad packs quite a defensive punch as they've allowed seven or less points eight times this season. The Warrior defense is led by senior linebacker and safety Joey Hobbs who leads the team with 163 tackles and 8 sacks. He's tied for the team lead in interceptions with 4 on the year on a defense that has pilfered 23 passes in total.

David Bahya, a senior QB, is completing 60% of his throws and has accounted for 21 touchdowns through the air and 2,192 yards. He has also added more than 300 yards on the ground and 4 scores. The rushing attack is solid amassing over 2,900 yards on the year without a single player going over 1,000 yards on the season. 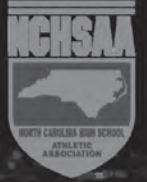

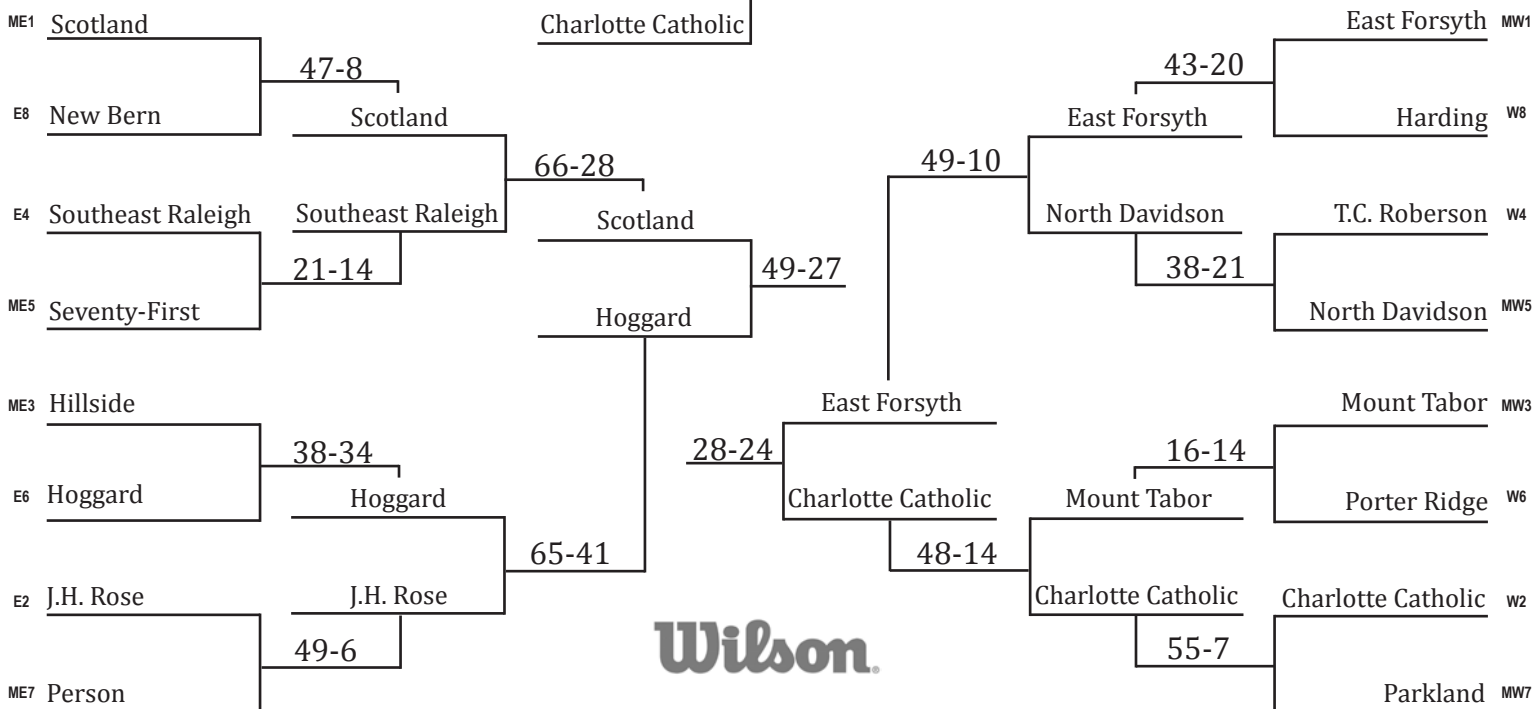
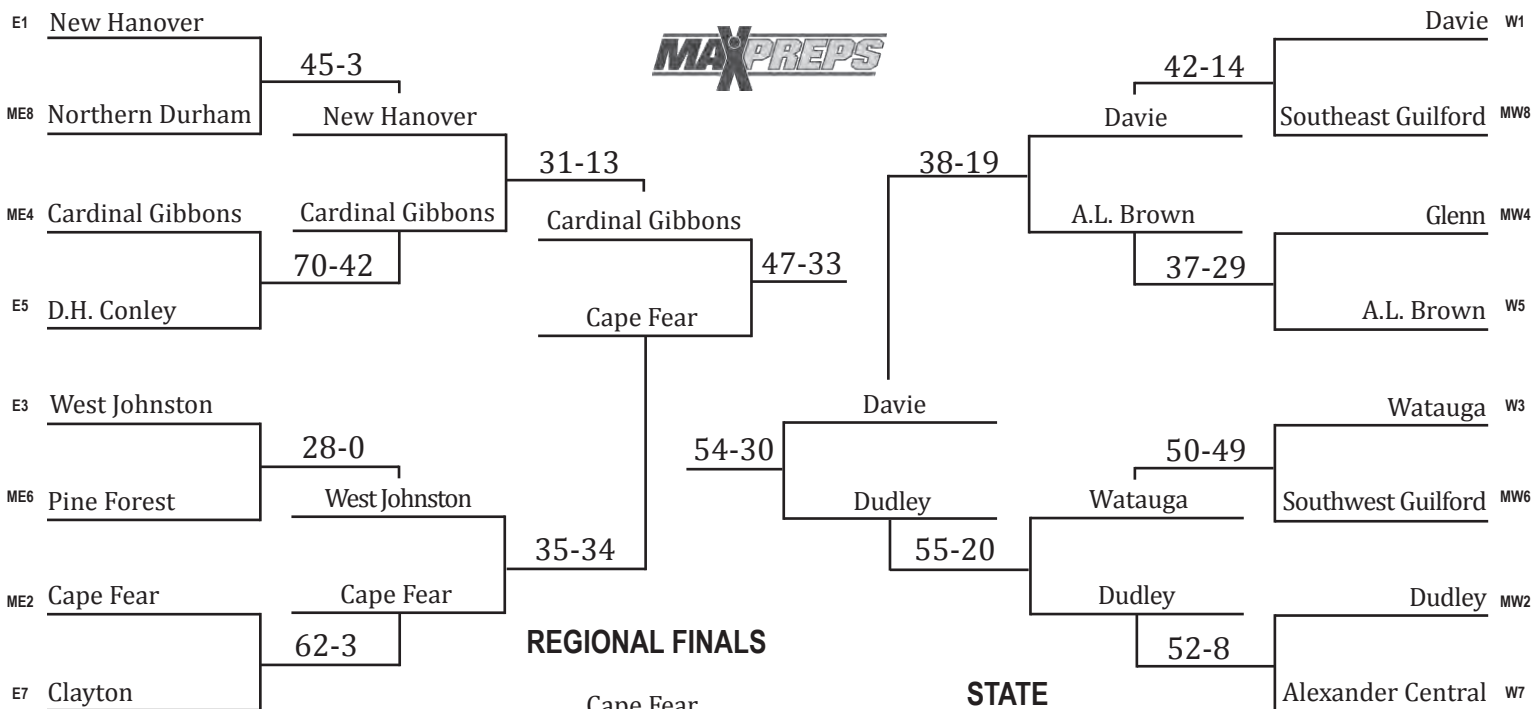

After plowing through the regular season in the Mid-South 4A unbeaten, no small feat against the likes of traditional powers E.E. Smith, Seventy-First and Jack Britt, Cape Fear won the first conference championship in school history, crossing the 10-win barrier for the first time as well.

The Colts arrived to the second round of the playoffs and found themselves locked in a tight contest with a fiery West Johnston. The Wildcats forced overtime and Cape Fear stood with their backs against the wall for one of the first times in their season. The Colts managed to scrape by West Johnston 35-34, but the tight game helped galvanize an already dynamic team.

A true dual-threat at QB, Justice Galloway-Velasquez, is the straw that stirs the drink for the Colts. He's thrown for 2,253 yards and 25 TD's on the year with just six interceptions while rushing for 1,814 yards and 24 touchdowns while averaging 8.7 yards per carry. In total, the Colts have rushed for 3,389 yards as Earlee Melvin and Malik Knight have each contributed more than 500 yards on the ground this year. Senior WR A.J. Baldwin provides a solid target on the outside for Galloway-Velasquez, hauling in 49 passes for 946 yards and 13 scores.

The Colt defense is powered by a pair of seniors, Jackson Parker and Jordan Ashley, as well as junior Chris Matthews, each with over 100 tackles on the year.

For Dudley, a team making their sixth appearance in an NCHSAA Football Championship game, this season has been one to remember. Taking challenges head-on has been a big reason for that according to Head Coach Steven Davis. "Playing a schedule that included Davie County, Hillside and Richmond County really tested our young men early and often in the season. Although we got beat up during these games, our young men found ways to continue to play at a high level," Davis said.

The Panthers are seeking the school's fourth state title, and have seen much of their success come through senior QB Hendon Hooker. Hooker is completing 61% of his passes for 2,425 yards this year while throwing 25 TD's and just 4 interceptions. Hooker has also rushed for better than 1,000 yards and 24 scores on the season.

With three players rushing for more than 1,000 yards on the year including Hooker, the Panthers can really control the game. Senior Ezra Perkins is the team's leading rusher at over 1,400 yards this season. Junior Zareik Rush is also in the thousand-yard club at 1,089 on the season.

The Panther defense has held opponents to single digits on nine separate occasions while forcing 29 turnovers this year.

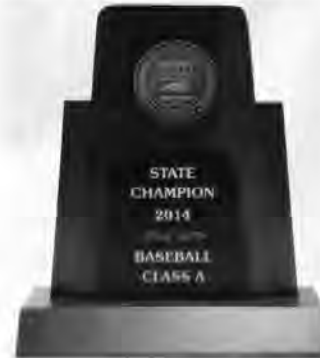

Steady progress, that's the key to Wake Forest's program over the long course with Head Coach Reggie Lucas at the helm. The Cougars are making their fourth appearance in a state title game since 2010, and will face the team that knocked them out of last year's playoffs in the second round in this year's final. Greensboro Page makes their eighth appearance in an NCHSAA Championship Game, returning to the finals just a year after falling to Mallard Creek in the 2015 title game. This year's Pirates are a force to be reckoned with as their lone blemish on the season came against Davie in week one.

Senior QB Will Jones has tossed for 2,859 yards with 35 touchdowns to just 7 interceptions. Many of those completions have gone to senior WR Ronald Polite who has hauled in 81 passes for 1,268 yards and 19 scores on the season. The Pirate ground game is equally as potent as Page has averaged 6.8 yards per carry on their way to 2,934 yards rushing this year. Javon Leake, a senior running back, leads the way for the Pirates with 1,553 yards on 8.3 yards per carry this year. He has scored 28 times on the ground, adding another score with a single receiving TD this year.

The Pirate defense is somewhat overlooked because of their explosive offensive counterparts, but the defense has proven reliable over the course of the season when called upon. 1A - PLYMOUTH DOWNS ROBBINSVILLE 28-20

WINSTON-SALEM, N.C. - The Plymouth Vikings jumped out to a 21-0 lead in the opening quarter and held off Robbinsville 28-20 to win the school's third football championship. Chad Dance opened the scoring on a 54-yard touchdown run to give the Vikings a lead they would not relinquish. Chris Kelly tacked on a one-yard touchdown run to put Plymouth up 14-0 before Dion McDonald recovered a fumble and rumbled 17 yards for a score to give the Vikings their largest lead of the day at 21-0 with 4:53 to play in the first.

Dance accounted for 113 yards on the ground with 15 carries. He was only out performed by teammate Chris Kelly who rushed for 150 yards on 27 attempts, including two touchdowns on his way to being named the game's M.V.P.

Robbinsville responded with Colby Hemphill crossing the plane from 3 yards out with 1:41 to go in the first and adding a two-point conversion to trim the lead to 21-8. Hemphill also scored in the fourth quarter, but the conversion failed and kept the Knights down 28-14 with six minutes to play. Hemphill accounted for 60 yards rushing with two touchdowns on the afternoon. Lane Millsaps, who rushed for 132 yards on 16 carries to lead Robbinsville, caught a 9-yard pass for a score from Colton Millsaps trimming the lead to 28-20 with 2:17 to go, but the conversion again failed and Plymouth hung on to secure the victory and wrap up a 14-2 season.

1AA - WALLACE-ROSE HILL BAGS BACK-TO-BACK TITLES WITH 48-28 TRIMUPH OVER MITCHELL

WINSTON-SALEM, N.C. - Wallace-Rose Hill rode running back Johnnie Glaspie's five touchdown performance to a 48-28 victory over Mitchell, claiming the school's fifth football state championship. The Bulldogs out rushed the Mountaineers 423-169, largely thanks to Glaspie's efforts, as he compiled 261 yards on 25 carries, averaging better than 10 yards per carry. He was named the game's M.V.P.

Glaspie opened the scoring with an 11-yard run just 4:17 into the game. He also scored from 4, 3, 59 and 76 yards on the afternoon. The Bulldogs also got 117 yards from Johnnta Wilson who carried the ball 16 times.

Mitchell's Tre Carson caught three touchdown passes among his 8 receptions for 139 yards. His third touchdown catch, his longest reception of the day at 57 yards, cut the Wallace-Rose Hill lead to 10 at 38-28 with just 33 seconds to go in the third quarter. However, that would be the final score for Mitchell in the game, as the Bulldog defense stiffened in the fourth while the WRH offense tacked on 10 more points, a Yahir Cano 28 yard field goal and the icing 76-yard run by Glaspie with 3:17 to play.

Turnovers were the Mountaineers undoing as the Bulldogs picked off three Ben Young passes. The Bulldogs only had one turnover as Mitchell pounced on a single fumble on the day. Wallace-Rose Hill finished the season 15-1, winning back-to-back state championships and capturing the school's fifth title.

2A - SHELBY RIPS OFF THIRD STRAIGHT CHAMPIONSHIP BEATING KINSTON 57-21

RALEIGH, N.C. - Shelby's Darquez Lee threw five touchdown passes, two to Jayden Borders, as the Golden Lions secured their eighth, and third consecutive, state football championship beating Kinston 57-21. Lee's five touchdown passes came on 15-31 passing for 256 yards and included an 80-yard bomb to Borders to open the scoring just 20 seconds into the contest. Borders caught six passes for 135 yards on the afternoon, the other score coming from just one yard out.

The Shelby defense stifled the Viking rushing attack all day, bottling Kinston backs up for just 9 yards on the ground on 21 attempts. The Golden Lions also forced four turnovers, three interceptions and a fumble recovery, to go along with a safety. Meanwhile, Shelby's offense racked up 214 yards on 41 carries helping the Golden Lions jump out to a 36-0 lead before Kinston cracked the scoreboard with 47 seconds to play in the first half on a 15-yard touchdown pass from Thomas Vermillion to Kam'ryn Webster cutting the lead to 36-6 at the half.

2AA - Monroe's first title, Wall's four touchdown passes carry Monroe past Bunn 38-19

RALEIGH, N.C. - Zephaniah Wall was simply unstoppable as he led the Monroe offense, racking up 283 yards through the air on 16-25 passing, including four touchdowns as Monroe won the school's first state championship beating Bunn 38-19. Wall opened the scoring finding Desmen Robinson in the end zone from two yards out giving the Redhawks an early 7-0 lead with 7:32 to go in the first. He added two more touchdown passes in the second quarter, one of 26 yards to Braxton Knotts and another from 23 yards away to Jadarius McManus, to give Monroe a 21-0 halftime advantage.

McManus then busted the second play of the second half 60 yards on another Wall pass to give the Redhawks a 28-0 lead in the early third. McManus accounted for 171 yards on seven receptions Knotts took Monroe's next play 51 yards to the house on a handoff to extend the lead to 35-0 with 8:13 to go in the third. He racked up 111 yards on 12 carries including the 51 yard touchdown run.

Bunn finally got on the board on a 1-yard Chris Bumpers run with 1:19 to play in the third, trimming the Redhawks lead to 35-7. The Redhawks kept Bunn star running back Tevin Perry in check for much of the game. Perry had 158 yards on 28 carries, but just had one score. The Wildcats only completed one pass on the day for 44 yards.

On the first offensive drive of the game, South Point methodically moved the ball down the field, 8 plays, 59 yards leading to a 2-yard touchdown scamper by Ryland Etherton to tie the game at 7. Both defenses settled in at that point, and the two teams headed into the locker rooms all square.

South Point took their first lead of the game in the early fourth when quarterback Diontre King kept the ball around the end for a 27-yard touchdown and a 21-14 lead. Things began to look grim for the Gryphons then, but senior quarterback Forest Bell converted on a third down and 16 in his own end of the field with about 5 minutes to play, giving the Rocky Mount side some life. That conversion kept alive a drive that went a total of 18 plays, 89 yards and chewed up 7:23 off the fourth quarter clock. The Gryphons capped that drive with another Bynum touchdown run, this one from four yards, tying the game at 21.

In overtime the Rocky Mount defense was able to hold the Raiders out of the end zone, forcing a field goal attempt that missed wide. The Gryphon offense went to work with the school's third state championship hanging in the balance. They gained seven yards on their first two plays, then electing to send the field goal team onto the field. That's when Chase Miller walked on the field, booting a 20-yard field goal through the south endzone uprights at Kenan Stadium and lifting Rocky Mount to a 24-21 victory.

3AA - HARBISON'S 7 TD'S LIFT CREST PAST SOUTHERN DURHAM 55-21

CHAPEL HILL, N.C. - Tre Harbison rushed for 295 yards on just 24 carries, scoring seven times to lift his Crest Chargers to their sixth state championship in school history, 55-21 over Southern Durham. The championship was their third in a row. The Spartans were without their starting quarterback Jalen Greene, sidelined with an injury, so starting running back Jordon Brown sliding in to the signal caller role. Brown gave the Spartans a brief lead with their first drive as he hit Jermaine Russell for a 15-yard touchdown pass capping off a 12 play, 60 yard drive and making the score 7-3 with 4:48 to go. That was Southern Durham's only lead of the game.

Harbison answered with a 28-yard touchdown run just three plays later giving Crest a lead they did not give up. Harbison actually scored the next three touchdowns, all in the second quarter, helping the Chargers expand the lead from three points to 31-7 at the 1:37 remaining mark in the first half. Brown tacked on two rushing touchdowns for the Spartans and threw for 225 yards on the day, but it wasn't enough to stem the tide of the Crest rushing attack. Crest rolled up 305 yards on the ground to just 40 for Southern Durham.

Crest finished the season a perfect 16-0. Harbison's mark of 7 touchdowns tied him for second all-time for single game rushing touchdowns, just a single touchdown behind T.J. Logan's eight score night in the 3AA State Championship Game in 2012.

4A - CHARLOTTE CATHOLIC HOLDS OFF J.H. ROSE 27-20

WINSTON-SALEM, N.C. - Fireworks exploded early in the 4A State Title Game as J.H. Rose's Cornell Powell returned the opening kickoff 90 yards for a touchdown giving the Rampants an early 7-0 lead over Charlotte Catholic. The next two scores went to the Cougars, and Charlotte Catholic as Jonathan Newman found John Walton for a 16-yard touchdown pass and Jaret Anderson cashed in from 32 yards out to take a 13-7 lead after one quarter.

Rose sustained an 11 play, 80 yard drive in the second quarter, capped off by a Powell touchdown pass to Mydron Vines that gave Rose a halftime lead 14-13. The Catholic defense was the story of the second half, as they held an explosive Rose offense to just a single second half score. Rose's Dontavies Harris knotted the game up at 20 with a 16-yard run with 3:28 to go in the third quarter, the point after no good. The Cougars took advantage of great field position late in the game, as they took over at the Rose 31 with 3:56 to play. Six plays later, Anderson carried 14 yards into the end zone, his second touchdown of the second half, giving Charlotte Catholic the winning margin at 27-20. The Cougars finished the season 15-0, winning the school's fourth state championship and first since 2015.

4AA - MALLARD CREEK ROLLS TO THIRD STRAIGHT CHAMPIONSHIP

RALEIGH, N.C. - The Mavericks of Mallard Creek are no strangers to the 4AA Championship Game and it showed as they blew out Page 49-6. They claimed their third consecutive state title with the victory. Thaddeus Mekhi provided the lone score of the first quarter as he hauled in a 6-yard touchdown catch from Jason Smith with 8:25 to go in the first quarter to give Mallard Creek a 7-0 lead.

The second quarter was all Mavericks as things got out of control quickly for Page. Smith found Ryan Jones for a 14 yard passing score on the first play of the quarter giving the Mavericks a 14-0 lead. A Page turnover inside their own 10 set up Mallard Creek with a short field and Chauncery Bowman capitalized on the first play of the drive scoring from four yards out and making it 21-0. The next two scores were Bowman 1 yard runs, extending the Mallard Creek advantage to 35-0. Smith added a 1-yard rushing score of his own with 2:27 to play in the first half to make it 42-0 where things stood at the half.

Mallard Creek got the opening kick to start the second half and it only took 6 plays for Smith to find Corey Sutton for a 24-yard touchdown pass stretching the lead to 49-0. Smith threw for 172 yards and three scores adding 65 yards and touchdown via the ground.

Page's lone score of the game came in the fourth quarter as Will Jones hit Javon Leake for a 71-yard touchdown pass. The Pirates were held to -29 yards rushing in the game.

Championship Venue Information



NC STATE - CARTER-FINLEY STADIUM



In its 50 years of existence, Carter-Finley Stadium has earned a reputation as one of the most exciting venues in college football, mainly due to the dedication of Wolfpack fans. In the past decade, the facility has been renovated to match the excellence of the people who fill it and has become known as one of the finest football venues in the nation for both its atmosphere and its facilities.

The south end zone is the home of the 103,254 square-foot Murphy Center, which is unequalled in its design for the training and preparation of athletes. The Wolfpack squad practices just a stone's throw away at the Dail Practice Complex. This area covers seven acres and boasts three full fields, a training room, restrooms and a tower where the head coach is frequently found surveying his squad.

Vaughn Towers, a four-level facility that boasts 117,000 square

feet, holds 51 luxury suites, 1,000 club seats and luxurious quarters for the media covering NC State games.

The A.E. Finley Fieldhouse in the north end zone houses two spacious, state-of-the-art locker rooms that can be divided into smaller locker rooms when NC State plays host to high school championship games. - Courtesy GoPack.com

UNC - KENAN MEMORIAL STADIUM



Kenan Memorial Stadium remains today as it was nearly a century ago – quite simply one of the most picturesque athletic venues in America. UNC's alumni magazine saluted the natural beauty of the new stadium upon its opening on Nov. 24, 1927; some 28,000 fans watched as the Tar Heels edged Virginia by one point.

Since then, Kenan Stadium has been home to great teams and outstanding players and the battleground for thousands of memorable football games on crystalline autumn Saturdays. From modest beginnings—single levels of seats on each side of the playing field and a simple field house—the facility has evolved with the times but has preserved its aesthetic appeal. Among the significant expansion projects have been the addition of the upper decks in 1963; the construction of the

south side press box, installation of permanent lights and addition of 2,000 choice seats between the 40 yard-lines in 1988; the addition of some 8,000 seats in the west end zone bowl and the construction of the Frank H. Kenan Football Center and the John Pope Box in 1997; the addition of the fifth floor to the Kenan Football Center in 2010; and now the addition of "Blue Zone" seating area in the east end zone and the opening of The Loudermilk Center for Excellence. - Courtesy GoHeels.com

WAKE FOREST - BB & T FIELD



Originally built in 1968, Wake Forest's BB&T Field is the home of the Demon Deacon football team. With a bleacher capacity of 31,500 plus several thousand more behind the end-zones, BB&T Field offers an intimate setting with fans right on top of the action. Considered one of the most beautiful stadiums of its size in the nation, BB&T Field has undergone significant renovations in recent years.

Dedicated as Groves Stadium on September 14, 1968, in a 10-6 loss to rival NC State, BB&T Field represents an extensive fund-raising effort undertaken by the college during the mid-1960s which, for all practical purposes, made possible Wake Forest's continued membership in the Atlantic Coast Conference. The stadium, which has 31,500 permanent seats, is

located between Reynolds and Deacon Boulevards, one mile from the Wake Forest campus. It also is part of the athletic hub of Winston-Salem, which includes the Lawrence Joel Veterans Memorial Coliseum, home of the Demon Deacon basketball teams and located across the street from BB&T Field, as well as Wake Forest Baseball Park, home of Deacon baseball and adjacent to the football facility.
