CHAPEL HILL – The North Carolina High School Athletic Association finalized the brackets for the 2024 Men's and Women's Basketball Championships on February 22 and the playoffs began on Tuesday, February 25.

The fourth round concluded on March 7, leaving just the Regional Finals and the State Championships to be conducted this week at the Lawrence Joel Veterans Memorial Coliseum in Winston-Salem.

There will be four Regional Final games per day at LJVM and will begin at 2 p.m. The following games will begin 20 minutes following the conclusion of the previous game but will not start before the listed start time. The State Championship games on Friday will be played at 1 p.m., 3:30 p.m., 6 p.m. and 8:30 p.m. Championship games on Saturday will be played at 12 p.m., 2:30 p.m., 5:00 p.m. and 7:30 p.m. The schedule for the Regional Finals is listed below.

NCHSAA Championships return to Winston-Salem

The North Carolina High School Athletic Association is excited to return to Winston-Salem for the 2024-25 men's and women's basketball championships March 10-15.

While the NCHSAA Basketball Championships will be at LJVM for just the second time this year, the City of Winston-Salem has served as host multiple times. The first NCHSAA men's basketball championship contested in Winston-Salem was in 1945 when Mineral Springs beat Sanford 41-30 for the Class B title. The Championships returned in 1953 for all three classifications, with the 3A remaining there in 1954. The 1A title was also contested there in 1959.

The 2A men's basketball championships were held in Winston-Salem every year from 1960-80. 2024 will mark the first women's championship contested in Winston-Salem.

Regional Championship Notes

Seeding Breakdown

On February 22, the NCHSAA announced the brackets for the 2024 Basketball Playoffs and named 16 No. 1 Seeds. Of those 16 No. 1s, 11 of them reached the Regional Finals. Three No. 1 seeds remain in the 1A, 3A and 4A brackets and just two No. 1s are still standing in the 2A brackets. The top seeds taking the floor in Winston-Salem are: 3A West Women Stuart Cramer, 3A East Men Swansboro, 3A East Women Terry Sanford, 1A East Women Perquimans, 1A East Men Washington County, 1A West Women Bishop McGuinness, 4A East Men New Hanover, 4A East Women Hoggard, West Women McDowell, 2A West Women North Wilkes and from the 2A West Men's bracket, the defending champions Reidsville.

There are eight No. 2 Seeds in Winston-Salem, including defending 1A Women's Champion Cherokee. The other remaining two seeds are 3A East Men Southern School of Sustainability and Energy (Durham), 3A East Women Western Alamance, 1A East Men Southern Wake Academy, 4A East Women Wakefield, 4A West Women Lake Norman, 2A East Women Seaforth and 2A West Women East Burke.

This creates seven No. 1 vs. No. 2 match ups in the Regional Finals.

Five double-digit seeded teams have reached the final week of the 2024-25 season, up from three last season. 3A West Men (11) Ben L. Smith and (12) Hunter Huss, 4A West Men (13) Chambers, 2A East Women, (12) Southeast Alamance and 2A West Men (15) Bandys all washed and packed their away uniforms for their trips to Winston-Salem. In the Regional Finals, the higher seed is the home team. In the State Championship games, the East Regional Champions will be designated as the home teams.

Squeaking Through

In the Regional Semifinals, the Washington County Men's team escaped Voyager Academy by four points 76-72 to punch their ticket to Winston-Salem. There were five games decided by one possession. More on each below:

Corvian Community edged Bishop McGuinness 52-50 in the 1A West Boys bracket as senior Andre Jackson Jr. knocked down a pair of free throws with 2.7 seconds left to win the game. Jackson finished with eight points,

nine assists and four steals in the game. R.J. Moore led the Cardinals with 19 points.

In the 2A Boys East bracket, West Bladen knocked off the defending regional champions Farmville Central 68-66. Farmville Central tied the score at 66-66 thanks to a 3-pointer from way downtown by M.J. Williams with 22 seconds left. West Bladen senior Hezekiah Adams answered just seconds later with a game-winning lay-up to send the Knights to the Final Four.

In the 3A Boys West bracket both Hunter Huss and Ben L. Smith squeaked out three-point victories. Huss topped the No. 1 seed Ashbrook 51-48 thanks to two clutch free throws from freshman Jaleel Smith with 1.7 seconds left. Smith finished with a team-high 25 points. Smith meanwhile advanced to Winston-Salem thanks to a game-winning three pointer in overtime from junior Kady'n Turner-Scott.

In the 2A Women's West bracket, North Wilkes held off T.W. Andrews 58-55 despite being outscored 16-6 in the final frame. The game was tied 54-54 before the Vikings took care of business at the stripe down the stretch.

In the 1A West Women's Bracket, Cherokee held off Albemarle 69-50. While this is clearly not a one-possession game, it is the closest margin of victory for the Lady Braves in their current 15-game winning streak. The next closest margin of victory was 31 points. The Lady Braves are beating their opponents this season by an average of 50 points, with a season-high of 96, when they beat Blue Ridge Early College 108-12.

Chasing Perfection

There are just two undefeated teams participating in Winston-Salem this week including Reidsville, which is currently on a 58-game winning streak and is 84-1 in the last three seasons.

McDowell 30-0 (4A Women)

Several women's teams are nearly perfect this season. Cherokee is 26-2 but is undefeated against NCHSAA competition this year as their two losses came to Winston-Salem Christian (66-52) and Hebron Christian (Ga.) (76-57). Lake Norman also lost to Hebron Christian, and that is their only loss of the year. North Wilkes has lost just once this season as they fell to 4A Watauga, but later avenged that loss by beating the Pioneers on their own court in Boone. North Lincoln has also only lost once this year, in the first game of the season, and is currently on a 29-game winning streak. Hoggard is 30-1 this year, with the only blemish coming 22-21 to Providence Day back in December.

In the men's bracket, West Bladen lost just once this season, to Farmville Central, a loss they happily avenged in the fourth round of the playoffs last week. Swansboro enters the Regional Final with just one loss, to 4A New Hanover, who is also in the Regional Finals this week. Southern Durham has two losses this year but like Cherokee is undefeated against NCHSAA teams.

Regional Final Appearances

Based on records available, Bishop McGuinness' Women and North Mecklenburg's Men are both making their 24th appearances in the Regional Championships. Below are the full records of each team competing.

NCHSAC Championship Results



The North Carolina High School Athletic Conference served for many years as the athletic organization for historically black high schools. The NCHSAC conducted championships in several sports, and Dr. W.T. "Army" Armstrong of Rocky Mount served as commissioner for many years.

The NCHSAA has spent quite a bit of time and effort trying to research state champions and other facts about the Conference, although what had been uncovered was sketchy. Recently, though, we acquired some documents which Tim Brayboy, who worked for the state Department of Public Instruction before his retirement, had discovered, and it sheds terrific light on the organization. The organization was fairly loosely knit in the 1920's and '30's, basically consisting of 30 to 35 black high schools with no well defined or consistent plan for declaring championships in any sport.

In 1946, a meeting was held in Charlotte to discuss reorganization. Dr. Armstrong was asked to draw up a constitution with rules and

regulations, suggest fees, and establish basic guidelines. There were 35 schools represented at that initial meeting. The organization actually used two different names during its time, including the North Carolina Negro High School Athletic Association and then the North Carolina High School Athletic Conference.

The conference's record membership was 215 high schools in 1959. That level stayed fairly consistent until the late 1960's, as integration began to take place. At its height, the Conference had approximately 90 football teams, 215 basketball teams, 75 in baseball, 30 in tennis and 40 in track.

In its last year of operation, in 1969, the NCHSAC was down to 48 schools, including 17 with football teams, all 48 with basketball, nine with baseball, four in tennis and five in track.

INDIAN HIGH SCHOOL TOURNAMENT



The Robeson Indian High School Athletic Conference began interscholastic participation in the 1920's. Original members of the conference were Fairmont, Green Grove, Magnolia, Pembroke, Piney Grove, Prospect and Union Chapel. Teams competed in several sports, but the post-season basketball tournament at Pembroke State was always a highlight of the year. With consolidation reducing the number of schools to four, the league added Hawkeye (Hoke County) and Les Maxwell (Cumberland in 1966 to become the Tri-County Indian High School Athletic Conference. Then in 1968 the schools joined the NCHSAA, just as the schools in the North Carolina High School Athletic Conference for black high schools did.

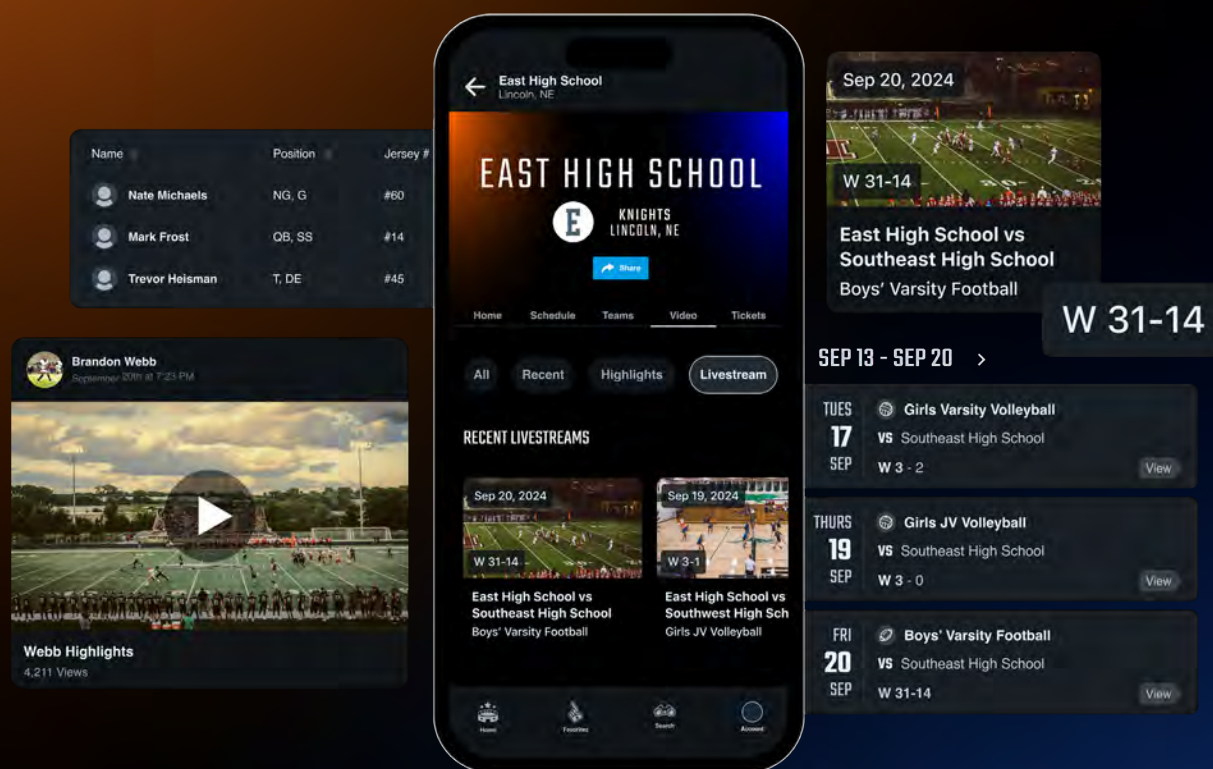
